## What is TalkingPoints?

TalkingPoints is an easy and safe way families can communicate in their home languages with their child's teachers for free. We will be using this platform to communicate with you about your child's education and progress.

#### How can families use TalkingPoints?

- School and teacher messages will come directly to the phone number that is registered in our system as a SMS text or through the TalkingPoints Parent App.
- You can reply by text or through the app.
- Families will receive messages in the language they have listed as their correspondence language. Families can reply in any language and the message will be translated into English for the school. 

# Algebra I Honors criteria:


- Advanced Math in 6<sup>th</sup> grade,
- 500+ on 7<sup>th</sup> grade SOL, and
- 91st percentile on Iowa Algebra Aptitude Test

(Algebra I is a high school credit course.)





### Math Course Sequence




#### Grade 7 Mathematics

- ➤ <u>Math 7</u> a curriculum which considers the foundations of Algebra and emphasizes the concept of and operations with rational numbers. The content covers the Math 7 SOLs.
- Math 7 Honors A more rigorous approach to a pre-algebra curriculum with an emphasis on problem solving. It is correlated to the 8th grade Math SOLs, but contains extensions and enrichment opportunities.
  Prepares students for Algebra I Honors or Algebra 1 in grade 8.
- Algebra I Honors A fast-paced approach to Algebra I, a high school credit course, which includes many extensions to the Algebra I SOLs.

# Who should consider moving from Math 6 to Math 7 Honors?

- ► Student with the goal of taking Algebra 1 in 8th grade
- Student who is performing well in Math 6 and has passed previous Math SOLs
- Student is motivated and willing to work hard



- Solving Multi-step Equations
- Solving Multi-step Inequalities
- Graphing Linear Equations
- Literal Equations
- Simplifying Radicals
- Laws of Exponents
- ▶ Line of Best Fit

### Why take Math 7 Honors?

- Our belief at Liberty is that Math 7 Honors supports student success in Algebra in 8th grade
- Content is more closely aligned with the Algebra content
- Opportunity to take an honors course which is not a high school credit course

### Current Advanced Math 6 Students 9 Move to Math 7 Honors or Algebra 1 Honors?



### Algebra 1 Honors Criteria (Grade 7)

- ▶ 91st percentile or higher on the IAAT
- Pass Advanced on the Math 7 SOL (500 +)
- Completion of Advanced Math 6
- All students are placed in Math 7 Honors until all scores and final marks are received
- Placement decisions occur over the summer Parents notified in Mid-July if their child will be placed in Algebra 1 Honors.

# Alg. 1 Honors Information



#### VDOE Algebra Description

- Offered to eligible students only.
- ☐ High-school credit 9th grade math course.
- Grade will appear on students' high school transcripts.
- □ 10 units of study of algebraic concepts.
- Mastery of Algebra is critical to student success in future high school math courses.


Algebra 1 Honors in 7th grade is an appropriate course for students who are eligible and who are willing to enroll in a high-school credit course.

Algebra 1 Honors students in 7th grade will take Geometry Honors in 8th grade.
